







The Oʻahu Business Connector (OBC) connects small businesses and entrepreneurs to nonprofits, government partners, and support organizations to help them grow and create jobs.

The OBC is part of the City and County of Honolulu's strategy to support small businesses and is managed by the City's Office of Economic Revitalization.

The heart of the program is its grassroots team of Resource Connectors who personally reach out to businesses and educate them about available resources. They've already helped more than 3,000 local businesses.

OBC offers events, seminars, and professional development to small businesses, and an online directory (OahuBusinessConnector.com) where businesses can find resources that meet their specific needs.

TIPS FOR FILLING OUT YOUR PROFILE:

- Use the contact information for the best person to receive incoming referrals
- A direct phone number or email inspires confidence in the small business that your organization has someone to help and respond to them
- Select the services that your organization would like receive referrals for
- Selecting specialty will move your organization toward the top of search results

Adding Your Event

Resource partners listed on OBC can add their events and workshops to the calendar:

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From the **Home** page, click **Calendar** and on the bottom of the page follow link to add your event



Add your event details including physical location if inperson or virtual if online.



Include a flyer or graphic for your event. Entrepreneurs are more likely to click your event if a visual is included!

Navigate to the page where you add a new event. Click **View Your Submitted Events.**

Creating Back Links

The way that websites are connected through hyperlinks remains a critical factor in search engine optimization (SEO).



Let's help each other's SEO!

TIPS FOR LINKING TO OBC:

- Where the link is placed matters. A link buried on an internal page three clicks deep on a website is less helpful. A prominent link and call to action matters.
- Including a visual with text narrative that is hyperlinked works best (e.g. logo, designed graphic with call to action, etc).
- The text that you hyperlink matters, this is the part that is blue and clickable. Best practice is to hyperlink keywords.
 - Great example: Looking for startup business help on O'ahu? Check out O'ahu Business Connector.
